

Wisconsin Conference President responds to Kenosha shooting and protests

Jacob Blake, a 29-year-old Black man, was shot seven times in the back by police in Kenosha, Wis. and since then demonstrations have engulfed the city. Wisconsin President Mike Edge in a <u>video statement</u> called for prayer for Jacob Blake and Kenosha residents.

"Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you; Not as the world gives do I give you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither it be afraid. John 14:27 (NKJV) In the most violent of storms, Jesus promises to give us peace. My prayer is that today, and in the days to come, you will experience that peace that Jesus so freely offers to each of us."



Lake Region President addresses police shooting

"Kenosha, Wisconsin, is within the territory of the Lake Region Conference and we cannot be silent in the face of the travesty that took place there a few days ago. We bemoan the unjustifiable shooting of Jacob Blake, Jr., and we join voices with those crying out for justice. Our prayers are ascending on behalf of Jacob Blake, Jr., whose life has been irreversibly altered. We resonate with the sentiments of his mother, who has decried the violent demonstrations and has appealed for peaceful protests that respect life and property. We pray for Blake's children, who may be emotionally scarred for life as a result of witnessing firsthand the near slaughter of their father at the hands of police. We commit to eradicating every ideology that divides or demeans, and every practice that decimates or destroys." READ MORE

Wisconsin pastor reflects on unrest in Kenosha

"Despite the challenges and limitations, we are called, as ministers and as members of the body of Christ, to speak truth to power, to bring light into darkness, and to be ambassadors for Jesus. I want everything we do as a church to be all about standing up for justice in our community. It's one of the reasons I moved to the city, instead of out in the country--because I want to be where the issues are so that I can better be aware of and address them. As Adventists, we have a long history of community involvement and practical Christian engagement with societal issues. Our little church district in our little urban area feels, in many ways, so unprepared for the intensity of the issues we've faced this past week. But the nation's eyes are on our community now, and that community needs Jesus." READ MORE


