nation and the increased tensions in our communities. As Seventh-day Adventists, we long to see inequities addressed and we long to see the Bible teaching <u>"loving your neighbor as yourself"</u> lived out, as the overriding guiding principle in our society.

"Last week was anything but normal in Southeastern Wisconsin. Death and destruction, injustice and intolerance: these evils plagued our city of Kenosha. I felt moved that we had to do something different. Everything is different right now, so I wondered what "different" even looked like. I wondered if different would be appreciated or supported or understood. But I felt burdened so strongly to meet this crisis head on, rather than shy away from it. 
