










## Cicero Church and Elementary School celebrates 100 years!

The first set of Afghan refugees are on their way to our area. <u>According to the US State Department</u>, there are 1,300 Afghan refugees headed to Michigan, 860 to Illinois, 490 to Indiana, and 399 to Wisconsin.

<u>Wisconsin Academy</u> (pictured on the bottom row) has volunteered to be a Donation Center, working with Team Rubicon to help donated items reach Afghan families. Each evening this week, students groups from recently-formed Sabbath School classes accept donations and will continue until Friday, September 17.

Wisconsin Adventist Community Services (pictured on top row) is also collecting items to donate to the refugees. Alice Garrett, Wisconsin ACS director, says, "It's been a busy week with the shipping of 95 boxes of new clothing to Fort McCoy, Wisconsin. It has been a blessing. The people welcomed the clothing with open arms. They were very appreciative."
