

This Week in Adventist History



The Berrien Springs Spanish Seventh-day Adventist Church, pictured here, joined the Michigan Conference on July 19, 1973. The church began with fifty charter members who focused on outreach and evangelism toward the 'over twenty thousand' Spanish-speaking migrant workers that regularly traveled to southwest Michigan in the growing season. The newly established church appealed to this population by '[creating] a church environment in which a Spanish-speaking person feels at home and can be attuned to culturally and socially,' according to the Lake Union Herald's reporting. Offering worship services in Spanish was both new and very important in the summer of 1973. At the time of its founding, the Berrien Springs congregation was the first Spanish-speaking congregation in the Michigan conference and the eighth in the Lake Union.
