
It Is Written will present Grounded from October 19 to 22.

This Month in Adventist History



October long served as ingathering season for Seventh-day Adventists in the Lake Union. During the crisp days of early autumn, church members of all ages gathered in bands to travel door to door in their communities, handing out evangelistic literature and collecting canned goods for the needy or monetary donations for ministry. In this photograph from 1964, a student registers to ingather with a band in Valparaiso, Indiana. His other options include Michigan City, South Bend, or the northern Indiana steel mills. In the October 4, 1922 issue of the *Lake Union Herald*, William Guthrie inspired church members to ingather for ministry, saying 'The word of the Lord to us is that one dollar now will be worth as much as ten dollars at some
