Adventist Health White Memorial Celebrates "Hospital Sabbath"





These girls may have read and been inspired by the words of M.L. Rice, Lake Union Conference President, who published a holiday address in the December 25, 1951, issue of the Lake Union Herald. He wrote, 'There can be no real Christmas without Christ. True, we may take a holiday from work, exchange some presents, eat a big dinner, and call it Christmas. Many will do this, but those who do only this miss the entire spirit of Christmas. To truly recognize Christmas is to recognize Christ as the Son of God.'
