

This Week in Adventist History



Madison, Wisconsin, in 1925. For over twenty five years, this sanitarium served the sick across Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, and northern Illinois. In March 1918, it was the site of a spiritual revival. The Advent Review and Sabbath Herald reported, saying that a "recent week of prayer proved a real blessing to the sanitarium family." Moved by the spirit, sanitarium nursing students took to the streets, offering Bible studies, distributing literature, and performing acts of service in the surrounding neighborhood. The revival was "a cause for courage and hope to us here at the Madison Sanitarium," the Review reporter said, because "God is impressing with his blessed truth the patients who come to us for help." Today, God's message of love continues to be shared at six Adventist hospitals and clinics across the Lake Union.
