New Pioneer Memorial Church Senior Pastor Selected

On March 22, 2023, Shane N. Anderson was confirmed as senior pastor of Pioneer Memorial Church, becoming the fifth lead pastor to shepherd the campus church of Andrews University.

He replaces Dwight Nelson who <u>announced</u> he is stepping away from the Pioneer pulpit.

Since 2004, Pastor Shane has served as senior pastor of the New Market Seventh-day Adventist Church in New Market, Virginia. The church, which has 700 active participants, also operates the Shenandoah Valley Adventist Elementary School and is the campus church for Shenandoah Valley Academy.

"For many years now, PMC has been one of the leading churches in our global Adventist community. God has worked mightily through this dynamic and diverse congregation, and I am excited to have been called to serve as its lead pastor!" says Pastor Shane.

He continues, "I am grateful to Dr. Dwight Nelson for his leadership over the last four decades. I am looking forward to getting to know the members of the Pioneer and Andrews family, and to discover the ways God has chosen for us to work together to achieve His goals."



Sixteen Pathfinder Teams Advance to Division Finals

Thirty-three Lake Union Pathfinder teams gathered on March 18 at the Village Seventh-day Adventist Church in Berrien Springs, Michigan, to test their knowledge of the book of John and its corresponding Bible commentary.

Teams scoring 90% or higher earn 1st place and can advance to the next level. Of the 33 teams who made it to the union level, 16 placed 1st and now move on to the division level.

"Making it to the Union level is an accomplishment. But going to the Division level is just the topping on the cake. We're so proud of the teams who've made it this far," says Craig Harris who has the dual title of Pathfinder director for Michigan Conference and Lake Union Club ministries coordinator.

The Pathfinder Bible Experience encourages teams to thoroughly study the Bible. Pathfinders accept the challenge of memorizing chapters and, in some cases, entire books of the Bible.

"The best thing for me is studying the Bible more in-depth. You get to learn and memorize these stories and take it to heart," says Jacob Rushford, a pathfinder from Wisconsin's Waukesha Warriors.


