After Shop Owner Slain, Neighbors Come Together To Honor Him, Pray: 'We Can't Police Our Way Out Of Everything'

Days after a Chicago merchant was gunned down in his store, the community that knew him came together to honor his memory at a prayer vigil yesterday (Wednesday). Members of Shiloh Church were in attendance at that rally. "Knowing that there are people willing to help is necessary," Pastor **William Lee** is quoted as saying. "The main thing is that people see there are people taking a stand. It's not about getting attention in the media, it's about our presence. We believe in prayer, and the power of it." *Source: Block Club Chicago*

Three children died when the Haskell Home orphanage burned in 1909. Their grave is still unmarked.

In the early 1880s, the Seventh-day Adventist Church began an effort to open an orphanage as well as an "old folks home" in the name of the church's co-founder, **James White**. Seventeen acres of land was purchased for the orphanage in Battle Creek in 1891.

A fire at the Haskell Home for Orphans in 1909 resulted in the death of three children and the complete destruction of the building. The remains of the three children rest in an unmarked grave at the Haskell Home Cemetery on the campus of **Battle Creek Academy**. A local historian and author has thoroughly researched the Haskell Home with the intention of one day writing a book about the once-famous orphanage.

The first black man in Kent County to buy land was a political and religious trailblazer

William J. Hardy and his family's contributions to West Michigan should be acknowledged, but their story is often only shared within a small circle--until today.

A small part of his story can be found while walking through an exhibit at the Grand Rapids Public Museum entitled "Newcomers: The People of the Place." The small display explained that in the mid-1840s, Hardy was the first African-American man to purchase land in Kent County and said that he sold some of that land to a second African-American man. But there is much more to Hardy's story. Hardy and his wife were the first Black Adventists. He was the first Black elected to public office in Michigan. Source: WZZM13






